For over 20 years, NPN have delivered **170+ free, expert-led webinars**, equipping thousands of nonprofit professionals to lead with clarity and resilience.

We offer this at no cost, with a singular purpose: to strengthen the leaders who carry the mission, and ensure the organizations they serve endure and thrive.

Building on this momentum, we piloted the **Leadership Acceleration Program (LAP)** in 2023 — a no-cost initiative offering executive coaching and peer support to Executive Directors of small and midsize nonprofits.


- All-volunteer board: Committed leadership without paid staff

- **Relevance:** Sessions address real-world challenges from growth to governance.








NPN Webinars: Powered by Practitioners

- Competitive Advantage: Equipping nonprofits with limited resources to lead with clarity.





Networking, Reimagined


We're piloting The Art of Nonprofit Life, a themed networking event designed to shift from transactional exchange to community-driven connection and stronger sector cohesion.
